TRACK ELGIBILITY CONTRACT

The following student/ athlete agrees to be responsible for and abide by the following conditions:

- 1. Health examination and consent form (UHSAA form "A" or form "B" turned into the school.)
- 2. Register my athlete / fees paid and turned into the office
- 3. Any prior "F's" in prior classes must be made up before student/ athlete becomes eligible to practice or participate in any practice or meet.
- 4. Any "I's" or "F's" from prior grading period must be made up or <u>specific conditions</u> met before student / athlete becomes eligible to practice or participate in any practices or meets.
- 5. All prior "U's" from any grading period (from 9th grade on) must be made before student/ athlete becomes eligible to practice or participate in any practice or meet.
- 6. Must turn in 3rd term report card to stay eligible no "F's" or "U's".
- 7. Students must attend all classes they are not excused from on the day of the meet.
- 8. Specific conditions: (ARTICLE XII- Drugs, Alcohol and Tobacco) Every effort shall be made at the local, region and state levels of participation to eradicate the promotion, use or abuse of alcohol, drugs and tobacco regarding participation in high school sports and activities. Limitations for participation of student in Utah High School Activities regarding the use of alcohol, tobacco products and other drugs, as defines in the Utah code are:
 - First offense: suspension from two consecutive games, meets, matches, competitions or performances at the same level of play (and any intervening levels as well). Practice may be continued following a personal assessment of the student by a licensed substance abuse intervention or treatment program and/ or participation in a district approved intervention program.
 - Second offense: a six-week suspension from games, meets, matches, competitions, or performances. <u>Student participation in an assessment by a licensed substance abuse</u> <u>intervention or treatment program with prescribed follow-up required. Practice may continue only after the assessment has been completed and positive participation in the prescribed follow-up is occurring.</u>
